mahmoud darwish is the poet laureate of the palestinian national struggle his poems resonate across the entire arab world and more than any other single figure perhaps since the death of yasser arafat he represents a unifying figurehead for palestinian national aspirations in this the first comprehensive biography of darwish in english muna abu eid examines the poet s intellectual status on two fronts both national and public and offers a critical assessment of darwish s national and political life based on darwish s own writings and interviews with people who worked with him and situating darwish s poetry within the wider context of palestinian struggles inside israel this book explores the influence of darwish s life and work in the palestinian territories and in the diaspora from the destruction of his galilee village and displacement of his family during the 1948 nakba to his return and infiltration back into the homeland and the struggle for survival inside israel to his internal and external exiles in haifa moscow cairo beirut tunisia paris and even ramallah

this prize winning novel the first to be written by an algerian woman in arabic is set against algeria s struggle against foreign domination as well as its post independence struggle with itself and the fate of revolutionary ideals in a post revolutionary society the story spanning more than four decades of algerian history from the 1940s to the 1980s revolves around a love affair between khaled the middle aged militant who turns to painting after losing his left arm in the struggle and hayat the fiction writer and young daughter of his friend the freedom fighter si taher all brilliantly told through khaled s voice it was features such as this convincing embodiment of a male voice alongside narrative techniques in which the author subtly joins the achievements of world literature with that of local storytelling and traditional modes of narration that particularly impressed the judges who awarded this novel the naguib mahfouz medal for literature

yfaat weiss tells the story of an arab neighborhood in haifa that later acquired iconic status in israeli memory in the summer of 1959 jewish immigrants from morocco rioted against local and national israeli authorities of european origin the protests of wadi salib generated for the first time a kind of political awareness of an existing ethnic discrimination among israeli jews however before that wadi salib existed as an impoverished arab neighborhood the war of 1948 displaced its residents even though the presence of the absentees and the arab name still linger weiss investigates the erasure of wadi salib s arab heritage and its emergence as an israeli site of memory at the core of her quest lies the concept of property as she merges the constraints of former arab ownership with requirements and restrictions pertaining to urban development and the emergence of its entangled memory establishing an association between wadi salib s arab refugees and subsequent moroccan evacuees weiss allegorizes the israeli amnesia about both eventual stories that of the former arab inhabitants and that of the riots of 1959 occurring at different times but in one place describing each in detail weiss uncovers a complex multilayered and hidden history through her sensitive reading of events she offers uncommon perspective on the personal and political making of israeli belonging

can we remember other people s memories the generation of postmemory argues we can that memories of traumatic events live on to mark the lives of those who were not there to experience them children of survivors and their contemporaries inherit catastrophic histories not through direct recollection but through haunting postmemories multiply mediated images objects stories behaviors and affects passed down within the family and the culture at large in these new and revised critical readings of the literary and visual legacies of the holocaust and other related sites of memory marianne hirsch builds on her influential concept of postmemory the book s chapters two of which were written collaboratively with the historian leo spitzer engage the work of postgeneration artists and writers such as art spiegelman w g sebald eva hoffman tatana kellner muriel hasbun anne karpff lily brett lorie novak david levinthal nancy spero and susan meiselas grappling with the ethics of empathy and identification these artists attempt to forge a creative postmemorial aesthetic that reanimates the past without appropriating it in her analyses of their fractured texts hirsch locates the roots of the familial and affiliative practices of postmemory in feminism and other movements for social change using feminist critical strategies to connect past and present words and images and memory and gender she brings the entangled strands of disparate traumatic histories into more intimate contact with more than fifty illustrations her text enables a multifaceted encounter with foundational and cutting edge theories in memory trauma gender and visual culture eliciting a new understanding of history and our place in it

winner of the counter current award at the 2023 palestine book awards all national identities are somewhat fluid held together by collective beliefs and practices as much as official territory and borders in the context of the palestinians whose national status in so many instances remains unresolved the articulation and imagination of national identity is particularly urgent this book explores the ways that palestinian intellectuals artists activists and ordinary citizens imagine their homeland examining the works of key palestinian and other thinkers and writers such as edward said ghassan kanafani naji al ali mahmoud darwish mourid barghouti radwa ashour suheir hammad and susan abulhawa deploying decolonial and resistance concepts such as palestinian sumud tahrir hamdi argues that the imaginative construction of palestine is a key element in the palestinians ongoing struggle an interdisciplinary work drawing upon critical theory postcolonial and decolonial studies and literary analysis this book will be of interest to students and scholars of palestine and middle east studies and arabic literature

this volume edited by leyla dakhli and klaus wieland is an overview of the cultural memory of the lebanese civil war as it has emerged and evolved over the last 30 years these narratives represent a counter memory to the non existent national memory undesired by lebanon s political class in 1991 the amnesty law g84 91 was enacted granting state power impunity for all war crimes including crimes against humanity the general amnesty entailed partial amnesia the war was to be officially forgotten and yet since the 1990s nongovernmental organizations archives activists publicists visual artists filmmakers and writers have produced an impressive alternative culture of remembrance of the lebanese civil war which is revisited and analyzed in this book contributors represent a multi disciplinary mix with perspectives from area studies history social science literary studies trauma and memory and peace and conflict

sahbaa al barbari s story provides a unique perspective on palestinian experiences

before and after the 1948 nakba born and educated in gaza al barbari was an activist in her community when israel occupied the gaza strip in 1967 al barbari and her husband mu in bseiso became refugees stripped of their residency rights and forced to live in exile for the next three decades while in exile moving from lebanon to syria libya kuwait egypt and finally tunisia al barbari held tight to her hope of one day returning to gaza her life speaks volumes about the struggle experienced by millions of disenfranchised palestinians separated from family members and their homeland this is the second book in the women s voices from gaza series which honours women s unique and underrepresented perspectives on the social material and political realities of palestinian life

the spatial turn has been deeply influential across the humanities and social sciences for several decades yet despite this long term influence most volumes focus mainly on geography and tend to take a eurocentric approach to the topic the question of space takes a multidisciplinary approach to understanding how the spatial turn has affected other disciplines by connecting developments across radically different fields the volume bridges the very borders that separate the academic space from new geographies through performance the internet politics and the arts the distinctive chapters undertake conversations that often surprisingly converge in approach questions and insights together the chapters transcend longstanding disciplinary boundaries to build a constructive dialogue around the question of space

khoury is one of the greatest writers of our times and perhaps the greatest arabic

language writer of this generation definite nobel prize material avraham burg haaretz who is adam dannoun until a few months before his death in a fire in his new york apartment a consequence of smoking in bed he thought he knew but an encounter with blind mahmoud a father figure from his childhood changed all that from mahmoud he learned the terrible truth behind his birth a truth withheld from him for fifty seven years by the woman he thought was his mother this discovery leads adam to investigate what exactly happened in 1948 in palestine in the city of lydda where he was born the massacre the forced march into the wilderness and the corralling of those citizens who did not flee into what the israeli soldiers and their palestinian captives came to refer to as the ghetto the stories he collects speak of bravery ingenuity and resolve in the face of unimaginable hardship saved from the flames that claimed him they are his lasting and crucial testament translated from the arabic by humphrey davies

this book brings together testimonials from people of different nationalities and professions who are pro palestinian whether as scholars film makers artists musicians activists or ngo workers using what oral historians call the focused life history renowned scholar rosemary sayigh invites her contributors to describe the experiences events motives and feelings that led them to support the palestinian cause the book is the first of its kind in palestiniography and includes voices from countries across the world a chapter is dedicated to each country and contributors are asked to reveal how they discovered palestine given that palestine is rarely mentioned in school textbooks or university courses whether by travel friendship study membership in a political party or book group they are also asked to detail what specific forms their engagement has taken ranging scholarly creative militant or charitable and what their hopes are for the international solidarity movement finally each contributor reflects on if they feel a just and equitable solution can ever be achieved for palestinians and if they accept the label pro palestinian or would rather define their relationship to the palestinians in some other way with testimonies from both high profile and grassroots activists the book is a rich and personal selection that reflects the diversity dynamism and global nature of the movement for palestine

in 2018 palestinians mark the 70th anniversary of the nakba when over 750 000 people were uprooted and forced to flee their homes in the early days of the israeli palestinian conflict even today the bitterness and trauma of the nakba remains raw and it has become the pivotal event both in the shaping of palestinian identity and in galvanising the resistance to occupation unearthing an unparalleled body of rich oral testimony an oral history of the palestinians who lived it uncovering remarkable new insights both into palestinian experiences of the nakba and into the wider dynamics of the ongoing conflict drawing together palestinian accounts from 1948 with those of the present day the book confronts the idea of the nakba as an event consigned to the past instead revealing it to be an ongoing process aimed at the erasure of palestinian memory and history in the process each unique and wide ranging contribution leads the way for new directions in palestinian scholarship

as one of the foundational texts in the field of postcolonial writing barbara harlow s resistance literature introduced new ground in western literary studies originally published in 1987 and now reissued with a new preface by mia carter this powerfully argued and controversial critique develops an approach to literature which is essentially political resistance literature introduces the reader to the role of literature in the liberation movements of the developing world during the 20th century it considers a body of writing largely ignored in the west although the book is organized according to generic topics poetry narrative prison memoirs thematic topics and the specific historical conditions that influence the cultural and political strategies of various resistance struggles including those of palestine nicaragua and south africa are brought to the fore among the questions raised are the role of women in the developing world communication in circumstances of extreme atomization literature versus propaganda censorship and the problem of adopting literary forms identified with the oppressor culture

taboo memories diasporic voices brings together for the first time a selection of trailblazing essays by ella shohat an internationally renowned theorist of postcolonial and cultural studies of iraqi jewish background written over the past two decades these twelve essays some classic some less known some new trace a powerful intellectual trajectory as shohat rigorously teases out the consequences of a deep critique of eurocentric epistemology whether to rethink feminism through race nationalism through ethnicity or colonialism through sexuality shohat s critical method boldly transcends disciplinary and geographical boundaries she explores such issues as the relations between ethnic studies and area studies the paradoxical repercussions for audio visual media of the graven images taboo the allegorization of race through the refiguring of cleopatra the allure of imperial popular culture and the gender politics of medical technologies she also examines the resistant poetics of exile and displacement the staging of historical memory through the commemorations of the two 1492s the anomalies of the national in zionist discourse the implications of the hyphen in the concept arab jew and the translation of the debates on orientalism and postcolonialism across geographies taboo memories diasporic voices not only illuminates many of the concerns that have animated the study of cultural politics over the past two decades it also points toward new scholarly possibilities

the culture of insurgents in early modern europe was primarily an oral one memories of social conflicts in the communities affected were passed on through oral forms such as songs and legends this popular history continued to influence political choices and actions through and after the early modern period the chapters in this book examine numerous examples from across europe of how memories of revolt were perpetuated in oral cultures and they analyse how traditions were used from the german peasants war of 1525 to the counter revolutionary guerrillas of the 1790s oral traditions can offer radically different interpretations of familiar events this is a history from below and a history from song which challenges existing historiographies of early modern revolts

algeria s arab jews were renowned for their metal working and jewellery making skills and these jewellers of the ummah the arabic community are for azoulay the symbol of a world that can still be reclaimed and repaired in a series of letters written to her father her great grandmother and her children and to the thinkers and artists she claims as intellectual kin such as frantz fanon and hannah arendt azoulaytraces the history of arab jewish life in algeria and how it was disrupted by french colonialism she begins by asking how her family became assimilated into the identities of israeli jewish or french as she does she finds a whole lost world open up to her the world of her family the arab jews of algeria she traces how arab jews were severed from other arabs and how arab jews were severed from their arabness by the israeli vision of a jewish diaspora and sets out to repair those breaks and revive their world but it is in the return to the carefully crafted jewels whose beautifully crafted objects act as messages to the future reminds us of the conviviality of a world that existed long before colonial disruption and whose memory challenges the imperial ways of thinking we have all inherited

in the decade following the 1993 oslo peace accords some 100 000 diasporic palestinians returned to the west bank and gaza among them were children and young adults who were born in exile and whose sense of palestinian identity was shaped not by lived experience but rather through the transmission and re creation of memories images and history as a result returning to the homeland that had never actually been their home presented challenges and disappointments for these young palestinians who found their lifeways and values sometimes at odds with those of their new neighbors in the west bank and gaza this original ethnography records the experiences of palestinians born in exile who have emigrated to the palestinian homeland juliane hammer interviews young adults between the ages of 16 and 35 to learn how their palestinian identity has been affected by living in various arab countries or the united states and then moving to the west bank and gaza their responses underscore how much the experience of living outside of palestine has become integral to the palestinian national character even as palestinians maintain an overwhelming sense of belonging to one another as a people

this book features chapters that examine the various ways of belonging in the middle east belonging can mean fitting in feeling at home feeling a part this kind of belonging is profoundly social belongings can be possessions objects closely associated with one s deepest notions of identity both kinds of belongings pertain to people and the kindreds ethnic groups and nations and or states they call their own belongings of both kinds are more often than not emplaced and territorialized all of the chapters treat middle eastern collectivities as sites of anguished cultural projects all use metaphor national territory as woman national resolve as cactus and so on none is reductionistic belonging is rendered in its complexity with its agonies as well as its joys all could be identified with a growing genre of work on belonging at the heart of each are the bonds that comprise belonging each one conveys both belonging s messiness and its joys and touches as much as it argues and elaborates this book was published as a special issue of identities global studies in culture and power

a sweeping new theory of world literature through a study of palestinian and israeli literature from the 1940s to the present makers of worlds readers of signs charts the aesthetic and political formation of neoliberalism and globalisation in israeli and palestinian literature from the 1940s to the present by tracking literature s move from making worlds to reading signs cohen lustig proposes a new way to read and theorise our global contemporary cohen lustig argues that the period of israeli statism and its counterpart of palestinian statelessness produced works that sought to make and create whole worlds and social time from the creation of the new state of israel to preserving collective visions of palestinian statehood during the period of neoliberalism after 1985 in israel and the 1993 oslo accords in palestine literature turned to the reading of signs where politics and history are now rearticulated through the private lives of individual subjects here characters do not make social time but live within it and inquire after its missing origin cohen lustig argues for new ways to track the subjectivities and aesthetics produced by larger shifts in production in so doing he proposes a new model to understand the historical development of israeli and palestinian literature as well as world literature in our contemporary moment with a preface from fredric jameson

explores how american youth are indoctrinated with zionist mythology and how to intervene in that process by teaching about palestine it argues that as the relationship between zionist education and the israel lobby continues to be strong it is necessary to correct the misrepresentations that infiltrate western culture the resulting encounters between two peoples who claim the same land have raised great moral and political dilemmas which benvenisti presents with candor and impartiality book jacket

in the making of a human bomb nasser abufarha a palestinian anthropologist explains the cultural logic underlying palestinian martyrdom operations suicide attacks launched against israel during the al agsa intifada 2000 06 in so doing he sheds much needed light on how palestinians have experienced and perceived the broader conflict during the intifada many of the martyrdom operations against israeli targets were initiated in the west bank town of jenin and surrounding villages abufarha was born and raised in jenin his personal connections to the area enabled him to conduct ethnographic research there during the intifada while he was a student at a u s university abufarha draws on the life histories of martyrs interviews he conducted with their families and members of the groups that sponsored their operations and examinations of palestinian literature art performance news stories and political commentaries he also assesses data about the bombers targets and fatalities caused from more than two hundred martyrdom operations carried out by palestinian groups between 2001 and 2004 some involved the use of explosive belts or the detonation of cars others entailed armed attacks against israeli targets military and civilian undertaken with the intent of fighting until death in addition he scrutinized suicide attacks executed by hamas and islamic jihad between 1994 and 2000 in his analysis of palestinian political violence abufarha takes into account palestinians understanding of the history of the conflict with israel the effects of containment on palestinians everyday lives the disillusionment created by the oslo peace process and reactions to specific forms of israeli state violence the making of a human bomb illuminates the palestinians perspective on the conflict with israel and provides a model for ethnographers seeking to make sense of political violence

crossing boundaries in the americas vietnam and the middle east is the personal yet profoundly political first person account of one man s unique interracial and interfaith leadership roles over five decades in movements for civil rights against the vietnam war and for arab israeli palestinian peace ron young s story told with honesty humility and humor gives an insider view of key events in these movements and personalizes a significant strain of modern american history not often afforded sufficient attention in either the textbooks or the mainstream press this book is an important read for anyone interested in these issues and movements it should be recommended reading for students in colleges and high schools

by placing the global and the intimate in near relation sixteen essays by prominent feminist scholars and authors forge a distinctively feminist approach to questions of transnational relations economic development and intercultural exchange this pairing enables personal modes of writing and engagement with globalization debates and forges a definition of justice keyed to the specificity of time place and feeling writing from multiple disciplinary and geographical perspectives the contributors participate in a long standing feminist tradition of upending spatial hierarchies and making theory out of the practices of everyday life

the nakba not only resulted in the loss of the homeland but also caused the dispersal and ruin of entire palestinian communities even though the term nakba refers to a singular historic event the consequence of 1948 has symptomatically become part of palestinian identity and the element that demarcates who the palestinian is palestinian exile and loss have evolved into cultural symbols that at once help define the person and allow the person to remember the loss although accounts of the palestinians experience of the expulsion from the land are similar the emblems that provoke these particular memories differ certain mementos memories or objects help in commemorating the homeland this book looks at the icons narratives and symbols that have become synonymous with palestinian identity and culture and which have in the absence of a homeland become a source of memory it discusses how these icons have come into being and how they have evolved into sites of power which help to keep the story and identity of the palestinians alive the book looks at examples from palestinian caricature film literature poetry and painting to see how these works ignite memories of the homeland and help to reinforce the diasporic identity it also argues that the creators of these narratives or emblems have themselves become cultural icons within the collective palestinian recollection by introducing the nakba as a lived experience this book will appeal to students and scholars of middle east studies cultural studies literature and media studies
