verbal attacks against israel for human rights violations have turned into physical attacks against the jewish community worldwide how has that happened this book attempts to explain the phenomenon anti zionists whose primary goal is destruction of the state of israel use accusations of the worst forms of human rights violations against israel to

delegitimize the state these accusations criminalize the jewish population worldwide for actual or presumed support of the state of israel the contemporary international human rights system and the existence of the state of israel are twin legacies of the holocaust the failure of the human rights system to prevent attacks on israel and the jews is an aftershock of the holocaust

the quest for an inclusive and independent state has been at the center of the palestinian national struggle for a very long time this book critically reexamines this quest by exploring the meaning of palestinian statehood and the challenges that face alternative models to it today rethinking statehood in palestine gives prominence to a young set of diverse palestinian scholars both men and women to show how notions of citizenship sovereignty and nationhood are being currently rethought within the broader context of decolonization bringing forth critical and multifaceted engagements with what palestinian self determination entails within a larger regional context this groundbreaking book sets the terms of debate for the future of palestine beyond partition

how did a community of a few thousand jewish refugees become in little over a century a modern nation state and homeland of half the world s jews has modern israel fulfilled the zionist vision of becoming a nation like other nations or is it still in biblical terns a people that dwells alone alan dowty distils over half a century of study as an inside outside analyst of israel in tracing this remarkable story it begins in the waning days of the ottoman empire when jews fleeing russian persecution established a renewed jewish

presence in their historic homeland it continues through harsh struggle and in deep rooted conflict with another people that sees israel palestine equally as their homeland immensely successful by most standards israel today remains a center of contention and is still torn between its hard earned role as a normal nation and the call of its particularistic and unique jewish history

of all the biblical heroes the character of king david is perhaps the most paradoxical and also the most difficult to grasp he is the biblical man for all seasons a warrior a lover a poet a killer and a restorer this elaborate and fascinating archetypal hero influenced and inspired the representation

of the israeli soldier in israeli media art and cinema from the establishment of the state of israel until the present day this book investigates whether israeli art and film now place a focus on soldiers not as fighters but as victims and the relationship between david as an adult and the state of israel half a century after its establishment as in gender studies it is only in the last twenty years that research on masculinities has become a prominent part of film studies although studies of men and masculinity have gained momentum little has been published that focuses on the media and their relationship to men as men in carrying out a study on the representation of the israeli defense force in israeli cinema the matter of gender becomes fundamental especially in relation to the motherland of israel eretz israel which is feminine by definition israeli films are also deeply concerned with territory and territoriality as such the book also carries out an ethnography of israeli cinema with a focus on the significant relationship between gender and nation and body and space

on may 14 2023 tırkiye will hold both the presidential and the parliamentary elections in which the turkish people will choose the president and all 600 members of the turkish parliament this will be the second elections since the transition to the presidential system in 2017 after the first elections held in june 2018 recep tayyip erdoğan was elected as the first president of the new governmental system and ak party received more than 42 percent of the total votes winning almost half of the seats in parliament as in the first elections two major political blocs will compete namely the people s alliance cumhur ıttifakı and the nation alliance millet ıttifakı the people s alliance bloc consists of the justice and development party adalet partisi ak party led by recep tayyip erdoğan the nationalist movement party hareket partisi mhp led by devlet bah

the great unity party b̄ȳk̄ birlik partisi candidacy of kemal k̄̄̄dar̄̄̄lu it has not joined the alliance it has become obvious that two political alliances will dominate the election process therefore there are effectively only two main presidential candidates while the people s alliance has nominated recep tayyip erd̄̄̄an the nation alliance has nominated kemal k̄̄̄dar̄̄̄lu for the presidential post concurrently there are two additional candidates muharrem ̄̄̄nce and sinan ō̄̄an supported by other small political parties that will no doubt influence the election results however they are not expected to get more than a small percentage of the vote the two opposing conflicting political blocs represent an almost absolute mutual exclusive perspective about the future of t̄̄̄rkiye and the politics of the country reflecting the increasing polarization of turkish politics these two alliances have two opposite and people s alliance emerged as a consequence of a domestic stance against the attacks t̄̄̄rkiye faced after the blood coup attempt by fet̄̄̄ on july 15 2016 which led to many major changes in the country the alliance aims to maintain the current government to consolidate the current presidential system to continue the country s transformation program to protect the country against both internal and external threats to increase its deterrent military power to strengthen its economic development and to globalize its diplomatic power the nation alliance on the other hand was formed as a reaction to the people s alliance since no one political party was able to challenge the power of ak party and its leader recep tayyip erd̄̄̄ō̄̄ the alliance is determined to reverse the course of politics in the country and to reverse many of the changes made by the ak party governments it claims that if it wins the

elections it will initiate a process of restoration revive the old political system change the regime revive the old and turn to the status quo ante however the nation alliance is quite a vulnerable and fractured opposition bloc it seems that while the nation alliance agrees on what it does not want specifically the rule of the ak party the bloc does not know what it wants instead there is no real consensus among the fragmented opposition parties about the future of the country not only do different political parties expect different developments even different wings within certain political parties make different suggestions for example some officials of the biggest partner of the nation alliance the main opposition republican people s party chp has declared that they will apologize helallemek to certain minority groups such as the women who were excluded from education and work because they chose to wear islamic clothing on the other hand some other representatives and supporters emphasize that they will take revenge hesaplaamak against other groups close to ak party another important event that reflects the division within and the brittleness of the nation alliance is related to the announcement of their presidential candidate not only did it take more than ten meetings and several months for them to decide but at the end of the process the leader of op akener left the block as she and her party did not approve the candidacy of kkkdarolu nevertheless she came back to the table just one day later accepting kkkdarolu s candidacy but adding two new names ekrem mamolu and mansur yava chp mayors of istanbul and ankara respectively to the existing five vice presidents indeed for a long time akener had been campaigning that one of these two men be selected for the

presidential candidacy the upcoming elections which are held on the centennial anniversary of the turkish republic put turkiye at an important crossroads it seems that two conflictual perspectives the bloc that supports the consolidation of the presidential system and the bloc that supports a regime change will collide while the people s alliance emphasize autonomy in foreign policy and seeks to achieve regional leadership the nation alliance promote an inward looking political system and withdrawal from regional issues whatever the position of the bloc one thing is for sure the turkish people want a strong leadership in foreign policy during this crucial global transition period the turnout in turkish elections is relatively high generally over 80 percent which is one of the highest in the world considering the politicization in the people s daily lives political polarization and the harsh political dialogue it seems that the turnout in the upcoming elections will be even higher furthermore the earthquake disaster of february 6 has further exacerbated aroused the political fault lines however at the end of this high level of democratic competition and turnout in elections turkish democracy will be the winner and it will be consolidated taking into consideration these developments and the importance of the elections not only for turkiye but for regional and global affairs as well this issue of insight turkey tackles some of the most important and determinative topics influencing the results disinformation has been one of the most noticeable ramifications we are experiencing of the digital revolution at the same time turkiye situated in a geopolitical hotspot is one of the countries that is both a target and a hub of disinformation campaigns in the region within this context fahrettin altun the
