stake the impact of the icc s involvement on the credibility of the icc itself is also reviewed recognizing the numerous impacts of the conflict on the existence of the two nations and the multitude of causes for its perpetuity it does not limit itself to the icc but also provides other conflict resolution alternatives that could enable reconciliation and sustainable peace in the region this book provides an array of opinions and a crucial input for researchers and practitioners alike while it is also useful to those investigating and possibly involved in prosecutions regarding palestine or other similar situations before the icc seada hussein adem obtained a phd from humboldt university of berlin germany an llm from the university of the western cape south africa and an llb from haramaya university ethiopia div
