in august 2013 despite that egregious breach of international convention no humanitarian intervention was forthcoming leaving critics to argue that un inertia early in the conflict contributed to the current crisis syria press framing and the responsibility to protect examines the role of the media in framing the syrian conflict their role in promoting or on the contrary discouraging a robust international intervention the media sources examined are all considered influential with respect to the shaping of elite views either directly on political leaders or indirectly through their influence on public opinion the volume provides a review of the arguments concerning appropriate international responses to events in syria and how they were framed in leading newspapers in the united states great britain and canada during the crucial early years of the conflict considers how such media counsel affected the domestic contexts in which american and british decisions were made not to launch forceful interventions following assad s use of sarin gas in 2013 and offers reasoned speculation on the relevance of r2p in future humanitarian crises in light of

the failure to protect syrian civilians

have called on the kings and emirs to reform their political system from the top down indicating the sizeable monarchical advantage historical dictionary of the arab uprisings contains a chronology an introduction and an extensive bibliography the dictionary section has over 500 cross referenced entries on the terms persons and events that shaped the arab spring uprisings this book is an excellent resource for students researchers and anyone wanting to know more about the arab uprisings

the syrian conflict constitutes one of the most covered events in this century although the coverage of the syrian uprising and civil war alternated between periods of saturation and silence it is indisputable that they received an enormous amount of media attention the syrian conflict in the news analyses the coverage of the syrian conflict in the new york times the washington post and the wall street journal focusing on how the three newspapers framed six key events in syria from march 2011 to april 2018 including the ghouta chemical attack the russian intervention in

syria and us led airstrikes gabriel huland argues that us foreign policy dominates the frames of the conflict which suggests that mainstream newspapers are excessively indexed to elite narratives in the united states the syrian crisis prompted an intense debate about the appropriate degree of us involvement in the civil war and how the country should behave in the face of growing russian and iranian influence in the middle east the overreliance on elite narratives resulted in the underrepresentation of local voices and other players who were in a more advantaged position to devise solutions to the conflict by analysing the frames of the syrian uprising and civil war in three mainstream newspapers and the relationship between media and international conflicts the syrian conflict in the news sheds light on crucial aspects of the crisis currently pervading us journalism

this book provides a comprehensive study of the complex impacts of the war in ukraine on russo iranian relations and the resulting consequences for the international relations of the middle east in contrast to dominant academic approaches which view russo iranian relations through the lens of anti hegemonic agenda and an confrontation with the us led international order this study presents an alternative angle stating that the war in ukraine has sped up moscow and tehran s interdependency primarily because of the protective benefits that it brings to both states the book analyzes various debates about the impact of the war on russo iranian relations from the perspective of the emerging literature on authoritarian regionalism the book explores how domestic politics and common threat perceptions play a role in these states decisions to adjust to the systemic changes caused by the war chapters address how changes in the strategic environment are affecting moscow and tehran s perception of each other what factors contribute the most to both states decision to pursue greater cooperation and how they manage the new conflicts of interest raised by the war the book also queries whether relations continue to be based on tactical partnership or whether a stronger alliance between moscow and tehran is unfolding and what the consequences of such a struggle for alliance will be for the wider region

the suffering of syrian civilians caught between the government s barrel bombs

and chemical weapons and religious fanatics beheadings and mass killings shocked the world yet despite international law and political commitments proclaiming a responsibility to protect civilians from mass atrocities world actors stood aside as syria burned again and again neighboring states global powers and the united nations opted for half measures made o r counterproductive choices that caused even more harm alex j bellamy provides a forensic account of the world s failure to protect syrian civilians from mass atrocities drawing on interviews with key players documents from the united nations and other international organizations and sources from the middle east and beyond he traces the missteps of the international response to syria s civil war bellamy systematically examines the various peace processes and the reasons they failed highlighting potential alternative paths he details how and why key actors prioritized their own national interest geopolitical standing regional stability local rivalries counterterrorism goals or domestic politics rather than the welfare of syrians some governments settled on unrealistic

assumptions while others pursued naked ambition the united nations descended into irrelevance and even complicity shedding new light on the decisions that led to a vast calamity syria betrayed also draws out lessons for more effective responses to future civil conflicts

this book critically explores the practices of peacebuilding and the politics of the communities experiencing intervention the contributions to this volume have a dual focus first they analyse the practices of western intervention and peacebuilding and the prejudices and politics that drive them second they explore how communities experience and deal with this intervention as well as an understanding of how their political and economic priorities can often diverge markedly from those of the intervener this is achieved through theoretical and thematic chapters and an extensive number of in depth empirical case studies utilising a variety of conceptual frameworks and disciplines the book seeks to understand why something so normatively desirable the pursuit of and
