defining israel the jewish state democracy and the law is the first book in any language devoted to the controversial passage of israel s nation state law israel has no constitution and though it calls itself the jewish state there is no agreement among israelis on how that fact should be reflected

some grains of the description of the billion years path this yearbook presents the global studies which cover different fields of research the present volume is the sixth in the series of yearbooks with the title globalistics and globalization studies the subtitle of the volume is global evolution historical globalistics and globalization studies which reflects the contents the present issue brings together a variety of contributions devoted to mega and global evolution part i historical globalistics part ii globalization and glocalization parts iii iv besides part iv comprises some issues on the view in the future we become more and more accustomed to think globally and to see global processes the yearbook will be interesting to a wide range of researchers teachers students and all those who are concerned about global issues

the state of israel is an unlikely powerhouse

in a troubled region since 1948 israel has retained its status as a democratic state without interruption an investor friendly environment and skilled workforce have led to a thriving economy whilst the israel defense forces are one of the most powerful armed forces in the world yet israel is also blighted by a plethora of foreign domestic and security challenges some of which threaten the very fabric of the state the cost of living continues to soar political corruption appears endemic and the conflict with the palestinians divides domestic opinion and sours israeli foreign relations thus contemporary israel remains perplexing resisting any straightforward categorizations or generalizations this book provides a comprehensive multi disciplinary analysis of the external and internal threats opportunities and issues facing contemporary israel the book comprises sixteen chapters written by recognized authorities in the field of israeli studies

alternative the author defends baorong duoyuan inclusive pluralism his own contextualized theory modeled after principled pluralism this model he believes has the potential to help ensure that religious freedom for all becomes a reality

raffaella a del sarto examines the creation of israel s neo revisionist consensus about security threats and regional order which took hold of israeli politics and society after 2000 and persists today the failed oslo peace process and the trauma of the second palestinian intifada triggered this shift to the right conflicts with hamas and hezbollah and the inflammatory rhetoric of iranian president ahmadinejad additionally contributed to the creation of a general sense of being under siege while israel faces real security threats israeli governments have engaged in the politics of insecurity promoting and amplifying a sense of besiegement lively political debate has been

replaced by a general acceptance of the no compromise approach to security and the palestinians the neo revisionist right represented by benjamin netanyahu and the likud has turned israel away from the peace process and pushes maximalist territorial ambitions but they have failed to offer a vision for an end to conflict and there has been little debate about whether or not the hardline policies toward the region are counterproductive del sarto explains this disappearance of dissent and examines the costs of israel s policies she concludes that israel s feeling of being under siege has become entrenched a two state solution with the palestinians is highly unlikely for the foreseeable future and israel s international isolation is likely to increase del sarto s analysis of this tense political situation will interest scholars and students of the israeli palestinian conflict middle east studies and international relations

the path to the obliteration of gaza was paved by the confluence of a set of longstanding forces this great conjuncture has transformed israel and the occupied palestinian territories while driving the region to the edge in the fall of israel dr dan steinbock connects the dots among these lethal headwinds what makes the fall of israel unique is its comprehensive scope it covers israel s political economic social and military changes the shifts in the palestinian struggle for sovereignty israel s degradation into apartheid rule the attendant atrocities the regional and global reverberations and the human and economic costs both prior and subsequent to israel s fatal war on gaza there its nightmarish actions have led to the engagement of the international court of justice and the international criminal court renewed international boycotts and massive domestic and international protests the fall of israel outlines the central drivers of this simmering tinderbox the serial expulsions of

palestinians the expansion of jewish settlements in the occupied territories a half century of failed u s diplomacy in the middle east and israel s militarization enabled by the symbiotic bilateral ties with the u s and massive u s military aid in the gaza war these ties fostered paradigms of devastation such as the dahiya doctrine and mass assassination factories backed by pioneering artificial intelligence the settlements have contributed to the destabilization of the broader region since the early 1970s and are now compounding its politico economic and geopolitical crisis this book addresses the efforts to institute a jewish rather than a secular state it shows how the postwar labor alignments were replaced by the hard right coalitions thanks to u s neoliberal economic policies assertive neoconservatism and jewish american donors it also explains the causes behind the rise of the messianic far right centrist parties and the failure of the left the corrosion of israeli society and

politics was already reflected in and driven by an economy constrained by adverse erosion as reflected by the liabilities of its high tech cluster the talent brain drain the threatened welfare state and subsidized religious sector but now the already evident politico economic costs to israel of the gaza war have set the stage for extraordinary uncertainty in the foreseeable future

jewish women between conformity and agency examines the concepts of gender and sexuality through the primary lens of visual and material culture from antiquity through to the present day the backbone of this transhistorical and transcontextual study is the question of jewish women s agency in four different geographical chronological and methodological contexts beginning with women s dress codes in roman byzantine syro palestine continuing with rituals of purity in medieval ashkenaz worship in papal avignon and the comtat
