this edited volume presents a critique of citizenship as exclusively and even originally a european or western institution it explores the ways in which we may begin to think differently about citizenship as political subjectivity

this book draws on rohingya oral histories and narratives about myanmar s genocide and id schemes to critique prevailing international approaches to legal identities and statelessness by centring the narratives of survivors of state crimes collected in the aftermath of the 2017 genocidal violence this book examines the multiple uses of state issued id cards and registration documents in producing statelessness and facilitating genocide in doing so it challenges some of the international solutions put forward to resolve statelessness rohingya narratives disrupt a simple linear understanding of documenting legal identity that marginalises experiences of these processes the richly layered accounts of the effects of citizenship laws and registration processes on the lives of rohingya problematise the ways in which international actors have endorsed state id schemes and by passed state led persecution of the group this book will be valuable for scholars studying global criminology state crime development studies refugee and migration studies statelessness and nationality citizenship studies and genocide studies the open access version of this book available at taylorfrancis com has been made available under a creative commons attribution cc by 4 0 license

centuries before w b yeats wove indian japanese and irish forms together in his

poetry and plays irish writers found kinships in asian and west asian cultures this book maps the unacknowledged discourse of irish orientalism within ireland s complex colonial heritage

grenville clark was born to wealth and privilege in manhattan where his maternal grandfather legrand bouton cannon was an industry titan retired civil war colonel and personal friend of abraham lincoln clark grew up on a first name basis with both presidents roosevelt and his close friends included supreme court justices he was well known and respected in the inner circles of business government and education in a very private public citizen the life of grenville clark nancy peterson hill gives life to the unsung account of this great and largely anonymous american hero and reveals how the scope of clark s life and career reflected his selfless passion for progress equality and peace as a member of the corporation harvard s elite governing board clark wrote a still relevant treatise on academic freedom he fought a successful public battle with his good friend president franklin roosevelt over fdr s attempt to pack the supreme court in 1937 he refused pay while serving as a private advisor for the secretary of war of the united states during the second world war and he worked closely with the naacp to uphold civil rights for african americans

during the tumultuous 1950s and 60s clark devoted his last decades to a quest for world peace through limited but enforceable world law rewriting the charter of the united nations and traveling the globe to lobby the world s leaders an enthusiastic husband father and friend clark was a lawyer civil rights activist traveler advisor and world citizen at large memories from clark s family and friends weave through the book as do clark s own inimitable observations on his life and the world in which he lived a very private public citizen brings clark out of the shadows offering readers an inspiring example of a true patriot and humanitarian more concerned with the well being of his country and his fellow man than with his own fame

blends careful moral argument with compelling narratives from field research among unauthorized immigrants activists seeking to protect their rights and the minuteman activists striving to keep them out immigrant rights activists especially those conducting humanitarian patrols for border crossers stranded in the brutal arizona desert are shown as embodying aspects of global citizenship unauthorized immigrants themselves are shown to be enacting a form of global civil disobedience claiming the economic rights central to the emerging global normative charter while challenging the restrictive membership regimes that are the norm in the current global system cabrera also examines the european union seeing it as a crucial laboratory for studying the challenges inherent in expanding citizen membership

this volume struggle resistance and violence examines the fact that all over the world the rights of citizens have come under enormous pressure and addresses the many ways in which people are making claims against both autocratic and democratic authority without any doubt rule breaking riots and violent upheavals have become an aspect of political struggles for citizenship the book takes up a conflict perspective that directs attention to these recent phenomena it stresses the necessity of a careful analysis

of resistance and violence as critical factors for coming to terms with social conflicts for citizenship from europe to south america as well as the near east the far east and the arab world

americans relationship to the federal government is paradoxical polls show that public opinion regarding the government has plummeted to all time lows with only one in five saying they trust the government or believe that it operates in their interest yet at

the same time more americans than ever benefit from some form of government social provision political scientist suzanne mettler calls this growing gulf between people s perceptions of government and the actual role it plays in their lives the government citizen disconnect in the government citizen disconnect she explores the rise of this phenomenon and its implications for policymaking and politics drawing from original survey data which probed americans experiences of 21 federal social policies such as food stamps social security medicaid and the home mortgage interest deduction mettler shows that 96 percent of adults have received benefits from at least one of them and that the average person has utilized five overall usage rates transcend social economic and political divisions and most americans report positive experiences of their policy experiences however the fact that they have benefited from these policies has little positive effect on people s attitudes toward government mettler finds that shared identities and group affiliations as well as ideological forces are more powerful and consistent influences in particular those who oppose welfare tend to extrapolate their unfavorable views of it to government in general deep antipathy toward the government has emerged as the result of a conservative movement that has

waged a war on social welfare policies for over forty years even as economic inequality and benefit use have increased mettler finds that voting patterns exacerbate the government citizen disconnect as those holding positive views of federal programs and supporting expanded benefits have lower rates of political participation than those holding more hostile views of the government as a result the loudest political voice belongs to those who have benefited from policies but who give government little credit for their economic well being seeing their success more as a matter of their own deservingness this contributes to the election of politicians who advocate cutting federal social programs according to mettler the government citizen disconnect frays the bonds of representative government and democracy the government citizen disconnect illuminates a paradox that increasingly shapes american politics mettler s examination of hostility toward government at a time when most americans will at some point rely on the social benefits it provides helps us better understand the roots of today s fractious political climate

resistance and rebellion lessons from eastern europe explains how ordinary people become involved in resistance and rebellion against powerful regimes the book shows how a sequence of casual forces social

norms focal points rational calculation operate to drive individuals into roles of passive resistance and at a second stage into participation in community based rebellion organization by linking the operation of these mechanisms to observable social structures the work generates predictions about which types of community and society are most likely to form and sustain resistance and rebellion the empirical material centres around lithuanian anti soviet resistance in both the 1940s and the 1987 91 period using the lithuanian experience as a baseline comparisons with several other eastern european countries demonstrate the breadth and depth of the theory the book contributes to both the general literature on political violence and protest as well as the theoretical literature on collective action

values and ways of thinking the idea of the good citizen appears to aim at constructing the adult migrants and their families identity something which many of the study s respondents make a resistance to as concerns the migrant s new experiences it is for example those which the migrant get through the contact with the swedish public employment service spes that affect the meaning making in the new society the meaning which most of the respondents have made of the spes s measures for them is that this authority only offers prepackaged solutions and does not provide the help or support that they need also the experiences which the migrant has in the civic orientation course and the meaning which old migrants give to him or her play a role when he or she makes meaning of sweden and swedes and of his or her new life situation further it has been shown that it is those experiences that the adult individual has been socialized through and those which he or she has gained through work or education in his or her country of origin which affect his or her meaning making in sweden it is mostly values which concern child upbringing and religion that lead to a certain understanding and construction of one s new life these values when related to the values which are included in the good citizen idea also lead to either a resistance or a readiness towards
