processes have not only influenced the idea and physical space of palestine but they have also become profoundly altered through their interaction with theoretical conceptions of palestine across the globe this outcome reflects an important emerging trend in global conditions which are brought into sharp relief by collins s expert analysis his approach enables a fresh en counter with the new politics of violence resistance and solidarity springing from what walter benjamin once called the tradition of the oppressed

this is the first english language book ever to apply psychoanalytic knowledge to the understanding of the most intractable international struggle in our world today the arab israeli conflict two ethnic groups fight over a single territory that both consider to be theirs by historical right essentially a rational matter but close historical examination shows that the two parties to this tragic conflict have missed innumerable opportunities for a rational partition of the territory between them and for a permanent state of peace and prosperity rather than perennial bloodshed and misery

falk suggests that a way to understand and explain such irrational matters is to examine the unconscious aspects of the conflict he examines large group psychology nationalism group narcissism psychogeography the arab and israeli minds and suicidal terrorism and he offers psychobiographical studies of ariel sharon and yasser arafat two key players in this tragic conflict today

want katherine boo ryszard kapuściski ted conover and philip gourevitch among them palestine is by any measure whatever one s politics one such place ruled by the israeli military set upon and harassed constantly by israeli settlers who admit unapologetically to wanting to drive them from the land forced to negotiate an ever more elaborate and more suffocating series of fences checkpoints and barriers that have sundered home from field home from home this is a population whose living conditions are unique and indeed hard to imagine in a great act of bravery empathy and understanding ben ehrenreich by placing us in the footsteps of ordinary palestinians and telling their story with surpassing literary power and grace makes it impossible for us to turn away

today the left faces new challenges from political forces amassing on the radical right the 52nd volume of the socialist register presents a serious calibration and a careful political mapping of these forces it addresses pivotal questions on the reordering of the new right these essays very broad in terms of

challenges the new right poses for the left at this historical moment what is the nature of the right s populism nationalism and militarism what is the social base and organizational strength and range of far right political forces to what extent are they influencing mainstream parties and opinion how have they penetrated state institutions what role do state security services and police forces play does our political situation today require comparison with 1930s fascism how should the left respond to defend democratic and human rights

this book makes uncomfortable reading both in its detailed analysis of terrorism and its causes and in the critique of state responses particularly in modern times it is unusual to have such a defence of a human rights framework from a counter terrorism practitioner rather than from within the legal fraternity it is this that makes the case even more persuasive all who are involved in counter terrorism strategy should consider carefully the arguments put forward global

policy journalfor more than 150 years nationalist populist marxist and religious terrorists have all been remarkably consistent and explicit about their aims provoke states into over reacting to the threat they pose then take advantage of the divisions in society that result yet state after state falls into the trap that terrorists have set for them faced with a major terrorist threat governments seem to reach instinctively for the most coercive tools at their disposal and in doing so risk exacerbating the situation this policy response seems to be driven in equal parts by a lack of understanding in the true nature of the threat an exaggerated faith in the use of force and a lack of faith that democratic values are sufficiently flexible to allow for an effective counter terrorism response drawing on a wealth of data from both historical and contemporary sources avoiding the terrorist trap addresses common misconceptions underpinning flawed counter terrorist policies identifies the core strategies that guide terrorist operations consolidates the latest research on the underlying drivers of terrorist violence and

then demonstrates why a counter terrorism strategy grounded in respect for human rights and the rule of law is the most effective approach to defeating terrorism

this book is the first comprehensive examination of un efforts to protect palestinian human rights in the territories occupied by israel more than 50 years ago in the 1967 war working through the un human rights council in geneva three top international legal experts served for six consecutive years as unpaid special rapporteurs with a un mandate to report on israeli violations of international humanitarian law and human rights standards being outside the discipline that controls un bureaucrats they enjoyed a high measure of political independence in carrying out their factfinding and reporting missions strikingly despite their differences in background and political outlook they came to a unanimous consensus confirming the routine and various israeli violations of palestinian basic rights this book recounts their frustrations their trials their experiences and their conclusions this joint effort breaks new ground in studies by the un

in several respects it demonstrates both the positive role played by the un in a politically controversial area and its blockage by geopolitical forces preventing it from securing the implementation of international law however the intense reactions of israel and pro israeli ngos to this un work most notably by un watch attest to the significance of a reliable accounting of israeli violations of palestinian human rights their consistent evasion of the substantive charges made by careful reporting and recourse by israeli supporters to discrediting defamatory attacks on the persons of these special rapporteurs with charges of anti semitism the core of which is subtly shifted from its proper usage as hatred of jews to justifiable criticism of the state of israel while some might argue that the un inability to enforce international law as futile or worse view the un as merely a vehicle of power politics this book proves that international public opinion and international solidarity politics are influenced by persuasive expert findings as to international law such well evidenced conclusions encourage

transnational activism as is evident from increased worldwide support for the bds campaign and other nonviolent external pressures this brilliant and authoritative account of the manner in which israel has administered the occupied palestinian territory during the past 20 years should be regarded as the definitive assessment of that situation
