The exposure triangle consists of the shutter speed, aperture, and ISO. Shutter and Aperture Priority modes allow you to set the shutter/aperture with a set ISO, while Auto ISO with Manual Mode allows you to set both the shutter speed AND aperture and lets the camera set the ISO to make a correct exposure (within ISO limits that you choose).

You need the precision in manual mode, but not in the auto modes, because the values chosen by the D90 are set steplessly regardless of how they are displayed.
b2 Easy exposure compensation top This lets you alter your exposure by turning the front dial without having to press the Exposure Compensation (lighten/darken) button.

On the top of the D90, on the left side of the camera, is a Mode dial. The mode that you choose with this dial determines which functions the camera will perform automatically and which will be left up to you. So if you want more creative control, then you'll want to select a mode that offers less automation and leaves more power in your hands.

In a new wrinkle, the Nikon D90 has only one autofocus mode in Live View, and it's not the traditional phase-detect AF. The D90's only option for autofocus in Live View mode is contrast detection.

Why Auto ISO+Manual Mode Is the 'Best' Auto Exposure Mode

Nikon D90 allows you to shoot 2 frames over exposed and one correctly exposed (+2F) or 2 frame under exposed and one correctly exposed (-2F) or traditional 3F which gives one under exposed, one correctly exposed and one over exposed picture. So the maximum number of frames for Nikon D90 is 3.

Shooting modes fall into three categories: auto, scene, and P, S, A, and M modes. In auto and scene modes the camera controls shutter speed and aperture. P, S, A, and M modes are known as exposure modes and give photographers a choice as to which elements of exposure—aperture or shutter speed—they wish to control.

Top, Nikon D90. The AF Mode has three settings. To select these, hold the AF Mode Selector and spin the dial just behind it. You'll see the indication change on the top LCD, and see it change on the rear LCD if you first hit the rear INFO button.

On the top of the camera on the right side you will find the power switch and shutter release button. Behind this are four buttons; metering mode, exposure compensation, drive mode and AF mode. The D90 now uses the standard 'press and turn the dial' method for changing drive mode, metering and AF.

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
